South Brunswick Township

South Brunswick Township is a large, rural-residential community encompassing nearly 42-square miles in southern Middlesex County. South Brunswick Township is comprised of Dayton, Deans, Kendall Park, Monmouth Junction and Kingston.

The township is one of the fastest growing communities in central New Jersey and is located between New York City and Philadelphia, making it an attractive area for families to relocate. US Route 1 divides the community in half, with Route 27 on the West and the New Jersey Turnpike on the East.

Over the past 25 years, the township population has grown by more than 15,000 residents. Today, nearly 40,000 residents call South Brunswick their home.

Voter Registration

To be eligible to vote, residents must be at least 18 years old, citizens of the United States, must be a State and County resident for at least 30 days and have registered to vote at least 21 days prior to the election. Anyone registered to vote may also vote in school elections.

Voter registration applications are available at the Municipal Building or the Public Library. Applications are also available online, www.njelection.org or by calling the Middlesex County Board of Elections, John F. Kennedy Square, Fourth Floor, New Brunswick, NJ 08901-1110, or by calling (732) 745-3471. Voter registration forms can also be found in the Main Office of each of the District's schools.

Absentee Ballots

In New Jersey, voters no longer need a reason to vote via an Absentee Ballot. A voter may apply for an absentee ballot, available at the Municipal Building or Public Library and mail the application to Middlesex County Clerk, Hon. Elaine Flynn, P.O. Box 1110, 75 Bayard Street, Fourth Floor, New Brunswick, NJ 08901-1110 at least 7 days prior to the election. A voter may also apply in person at the Middlesex County Clerk's Office until 3 p.m., the day before the election.

The County Clerk cannot accept faxed copies of an Absentee Ballot Application.

The school district has approximately 9,000 students enrolled in its 10 school communities, including seven elementary schools for students in Grades K-5, a two-campus middle school for students in Grades 6-8 and a high school for Grades 9-12.

Mission Statement

South Brunswick Public Schools will prepare students to be life-long learners, critical thinkers, effective communicators and wise decision-makers. The schools will maintain an environment that promotes intellectual challenge, creativity, social and emotional growth and the healthy physical development of each student.

The school district publishes an annual school calendar that lists a majority of the major events occurring at our schools throughout the school year. In addition, the calendar also includes important information about the programs and services for which the District offers its students and families. Registration Policy

Effective with the 2006-2007 school year students who are being enrolled in Kindergarten must be five years of age by November 30, 2006. Effective with the 2007-2008 school year and every year thereafter, students who are being enrolled in Kindergarten must be five years of age before October 31.

In order to register a student in our schools, parents/guardians must present the following documentation at the time of enrollment:

Immunization Records

Proof of Residence (e.g. Deed or Lease or signed Contract of Sale, if in effect)
Passport or Original Birth Certificate with raised seal

Proof of guardianship, as well as the name and address of the student's former school of attendance and student records are also required for students registering for grades other than Kindergarten, if applicable.

Enrollment is considered incomplete if all of the above documents are not presented at the time of registration.

All Kindergarten registration paperwork must be completed at the school on the day you register your child.

Parents/guardians may register their child(ren) during regular summer hours. Call your school to schedule an appointment.
